Video Competition Guidelines and Rules

Movie Topic: “Dreaming of...” You finish the thought! Movies should be 3-5 minutes in length.

Teams: Teams may be between 4-6 members. All members of the team must be current members in good standing with the USIHC at the time they submit the project. Members must be no older than having their 18th birthday during 2020.

As a minimum requirement, the film needs to involve at least one Icelandic horse and must feature at least half of the registered group. All other aspects (story, setting, music, etc.) are free for the team to agree on. Each member needs to have a clearly defined and identifiable role in the production. All riders shown on a horse must wear a helmet at all times.

The movie must have title and credits, date, and venue, and other formal aspects for a proper movie. The movie must be created between the first of June 2020 and the first of September 2020 but may use old photographs or video clips as part of the movie.

Judging: The videos will be submitted to the USIHC and reviewed by a panel of 5 judges. The top 5 selected videos selected will be sent on to judging by the FEIF judge panel for selection of an international winner. A sample judging form will be provided.

Video Links: When uploading your video, make sure the visibility setting is on unlisted. Any video which has been widely circulated before the end of the competition (more than 20 viewings), will be disqualified.

Music and copyright: Please be aware of national and international copy-right legislation and the rules for using music on YouTube. Some videos may have no sound.

Branding: Within reason, participants should be encouraged to avoid highlighting brands. This project should not need any sponsorship.

Access to horses: This was the main reason for the title is that not having access to a horse should not be an obstacle. You can include photographs, or old video footage of your horse(s) – something to dream about in the past, present, or for the future. This also means kids who do not own a horse can participate, and should be encouraged to do so.

Language: Keep in mind the FEIF international language is English. Remember that the resulting film will be shown to an international audience so keep dialogue understandable and reasonable.
