Policy #31: Regional Club Clinic or Schooling Show Support (2019)

Policy #31 has been budgeted \$3500 for 2019 by the USIHC to support clinics or schooling shows held by USIHC regional clubs (\$250 per club). Funds will be distributed up to \$250/club, for the calendar year 2019 subject to the eligibility requirements below.

Eligibility:

- 1. The event details must be submitted to both the Affiliated Club Committee Chair (affiliated_clubs@icelandics.org) and the USIHC Secretary (calendar@icelandics.org) for inclusion in the USIHC Calendar of Events no later than 1 month (30 days) before the event. (The club hosting the event must be in good standing with the USIHC at the time of event submission for inclusion on Event calendar.)
- 2. Each regional club will be eligible for not more than one \$250 grant in 2019.
- 3. Funds will be based on the number of USIHC member participants (in good standing at the time of the event), for each USIHC member participating, the club will receive \$25.00, for up to 10 USIHC members. Total not to exceed \$250.
- 4. The regional club hosting the event must be in good standing with the USIHC at the time of the event.
- 5. New regional clubs formed after January 1, 2019, will be eligible for funding only if the budget allows and therefore are not guaranteed funding.
- 6. Upon completion of the event, the regional club will submit a list of all USIHC participants in good standing (names) and the total number of participants (USIHC and non USIHC) to the Affiliated Club Committee Chair.
- 7. Once the event has been approved as successfully completed, payment will be issued to the Regional Club by the USIHC Treasurer.

Suggested (but not required): Affiliated Club include a write up of the event in the Quarterly.

Proposal from the Board of FEIF

G10 - Objections and Arbitration Rules

Motivation: The Board of FEIF proposes an amendment to the wording in G10 as the number of members of the Arbitration Council is at the moment missing in the FEIF Rules and Regulations. The Board proposes to add this missing information.

G10 General Principles

....

The FEIF Arbitration Council is elected in accordance with Chapter 5 in the Statutes and has jurisdiction as set out therein. *The Arbitration Committee shall consist of 3 members*.

G10.6.3.4 Procedures

There is a layout mistake in the 2019 rule books, where this head line has 2 numbers, resulting from a change made in the numbering made in 2018.

B3.3 Conformation

Motivation: This is not a change but only a clarification.

. . .

If a horse has been fully assessed for conformation and riding and received a total score, the owner can choose to use this last conformation assessment within the current calendar year, including measurements – except for length of hooves. The body measurements and the conformation marks are taken from last assessment and the horse must be only shown for ridden abilities.

 B3.4 Weighting proportion of each single trait (proposal from Iceland in cooperation with the FEIF breeding committee)

Motivation: These changes are in line with up-coming changes to the breeding objectives and judging scale that are to be discussed at the breeding leader meeting. Recent results regarding the relationship between conformation and riding ability call for a revision of the weighting of the traits of conformation. The weighting of the traits of riding ability could reflect better the modern use of the horse.



The idea is to revise the weight on the traits in the total score for breeding horses and that revision goes hand in hand with the revision of the breeding goals and of the judging scale.

The main changes are as following, they can be seen in the table below along with further reading describing the changes in more detail:

- To raise the total weight on riding ability as the gaiting ability of the horse is the most important aspect of the horse
- To raise the total weight of the basic gaits in order to put more emphasis on the versatile types of horses within the population (whether they possess four or five gaits)
- To define canter as a separate trait. The assessment of canter is now combined with the assessment of gallop but by doing this, canter would have a direct effect on the total score. It is sensible to divide gallop and canter into two traits with separate weights as canter is a three-beat gait and gallop is a four-beat gait (they are defined in many countries as two separate gaits).
- To raise the weight on back and croup. Recent research and knowledge confirm the importance of this trait with respect to gaiting ability.
- To change the name of the trait spirit to rideability
- To calculate an extra total score for each horse; a so-called four-gait total score where the weight of pace is distributed proportionally to the other traits of riding ability. This would be done for every single horse, no matter if it is a four-gaiter or five-gaiter.

B4.1 Show Manager

Motivation: This is just a clarification and not a change.

At all breeding shows with more than 10 participants, it is necessary to appoint a Show Manager, who is responsible for running the show in cooperation with the judging panel. In addition, it is necessary to appoint personal to control the taking of measurements, computer operators, and announcers as needed. *The show manager and ring master can be the same person.*

Specific tasks include:

- a) supervise the running of the breeding show.
- b) ensure that the communications between judges and riders work.
- c) ensure that the judges can work undisturbed.



d) together with the chief judge, ensure that the current FEIF Rules and Regulations are upheld. The annual breeding leader meeting 2019 accepted the text with the changes in accordance with the suggestion above.

B4.3.2 Judges' Secretary

Motivation: delete as it is not necessary.

The judges working as a group shall need one secretary between them to assist with completing the necessary forms.

The annual breeding leader meeting 2019 accepted the text with the changes in accordance with the suggestion above.

B4.5 Ring master

The annual breeding leader meeting 2019 accepted the text with the changes in accordance with the suggestion above. Breeding judges can at the same event be ringmasters at smaller shows as long as they are listed as official ring masters.

Ring masters at breeding shows need to be certified by FEIF. Certification can be attained by attending a seminar for ring masters which is organized by the breeding committee of FEIF. A ringmaster test may also be implemented.

Specific tasks include:

- a) Confirm the identity of participating horses and their eligibility according to G7.3.1.
- b) Health inspection of all horses prior to conformation assessment according to B11.1.5.
- c) Measuring of horses attending the show according to B11.1.3 and B11.1.4.
- d) Equipment check and health inspection after the first and second assessment of riding ability according to G8 and B11.1.5, respectively.

Sport Proposals - Delegates Assembly 2020

1. G9.2.1 Oval track tests and details on tracks

All tests taking place on the oval track must be carried out on oval tracks, which satisfy the standard dimensions shown in the drawings in S16 S14 (Addendum 9). When groups of riders are riding to the speaker's instructions, the time a specific section is shown shall be according to the table set by the FEIF Sport Committee and published in S13 S11 (Addendum 5). The track should be even and firm, 250.00 m long with an outer circumference of 271.69 m and

an inner circumference of 246.56 m, and a width of 4.00 m, following the drawings included. The radius of the inner side of the curves should be 13 m, the radius of the outer side of the curves 17 m. The length of the long sides (between the curves) should be 70.44 m; the short sides (between the curves) should be 12.00 m. There should be a minimal gradient of 1.5% toward the inner side of the track to drain water. The fencing should be low and not disturbing horses or judges. Refer to the drawings for other measures. A gradient towards the inner side of the track (long sides and short sides between the curves) op to 3.75% and towards the inner side of the track in the curves up to 7.5% is allowed.

Report from the Breeding Department

The last FEIF – Breeding – year started with a technical workshop for WorldFengur Registrars in Berlin with 24 participants from 11 different FEIF member countries. The workshop addressed actual issues of horse registration in WorldFengur, such as the EU Regulation for horse identification and registration, the EU Regulation for Studbooks and the exchange of data between WorldFengur and other information systems.

Before the start of the breeding season 2019, 21 experienced ringmaster participated in the 3rd Ringmaster meeting in Gardermoen, Norway. Main topics of this seminar included a lecture on injuries found with breeding horses, demonstration and practical demonstration of measurements and equipment controls, health control procedures and more interesting topics. The goal of the seminar was the improvement and standardization of checking procedures in FEIF breeding assessments.



Besides numerous breeding shows all over the FEIF member countries (in total 51 breeding shows with 1847 full assessments), the World Championships in Berlin, Germany with 36 top breeding horses were the most important event in 2019. In the breeding show at the championships 36 breeding horses participated from nine countries, the countries are (number of horses within brackets): Austria (2), Belgium (1), Switzerland (2), Germany (6), Denmark (6), Iceland (6), Netherlands (1), Norway (6) and Sweden (6). So, five out of the nine countries sent a full team, but each country can send six horses to the championships, including a maximum number of two horses within each age/sex class. The breeding part started during the weekend before the

pionships with measurements of the horses and veterinarian checks.

In 2019 the Breeding Committee consisted of: Frauke Schenzel, DE (Rider representative), John Siiger Hansen, DK, Maria Siepe-Gunkel, DE and Þorvaldur Kristjánsson, IS. As Director of Breeding I am a member and chairman of this committee.

The Breeding Judges Committee consisted of Elsa Albertsdóttir, IS, Heimir Gunnarsson, SE, John Siiger Hansen, DK (Chairman of the Breeding Judges Committee), and Rebecka Frey (SE). As agreed by the breeding leader meeting, one member of the committee is elected by the breeding judges themselves by online voting, the BLM will elect the other member of the group and the chairperson of the committee. As Director of Breeding, I am advised by this committee and join their meetings if required.

In October 2019, the breeding committee and the breeding judges committee met at the FEIF Committee meetings in the Netherlands and used the opportunity of this work meeting to prepare the proposals for the Delegates' Assembly 2020 and the Annual Meetings 2020 that will take part in Iceland in 2020. The details on the revision of the weight on the traits in the total score for breeding horses and at the same time the revision of the breeding goals and the judging scale with more emphasis on suppleness and quality in different speed ranges were prepared for the presentation and changes next year. The evaluation of the breeding show at the World Championships and possible consequences thereof to make the breeding presentations at the next World Championships more interesting resulted in a lively discussion. The breeding judges committee worked on the possibilities how to continue with the young horse assessment system in future and will prepare this topic among others for the breeding leader meeting.

As agreed at the Conference 2019 in Berlin, the FEIF Equipment Committee. The main focus of this new committee (members: Þorvaldur Kristjánsson (breeding), Jean-Paul Balz (sport), Silke Feuchthofen (education, chair), Susanne Braun (veterinarian) and Rasmus Möller Jensen (co-author of the FEIF equipment manual) is on the harmonization of equipment – not only the red list of forbidden equipment – in sport and breeding.



AND THE NEXT FEIF YEAR 2019-2020

Unfortunately the Breeding horse trainer seminars did not take place in 2019 due to problems finding a place with adequate numbers of trained breeding horses. We will however do our best to organize these popular seminars again in 2020. Hopefully at Holar or another location in Iceland.

Based on the proposal to add a Young Committee Member to the FEIF departments (accepted by the Delegates' Assembly 2019), FEIF invited young persons to apply for any of the committees they are interested in, with the possibility to attend the FEIF conference in February and the committee meetings in October. By reserving a place exclusively for a young person, we aim to add a new perspective to our work and to create a pool of young people who learn to better understand the work of FEIF. We are very happy that there were several applications, so that we will from now on be supported in our committee work by a young, enthusiastic and experienced young member: Johannes Amplatz (IT).

We already started discussions with the organizers of the past World Championships and also with the organizers of 2021 and 2023 on the future of World Championships – the aim is to make the breeding show at the World Championships more interesting. We are aware that this is a challenge, but it will be necessary to start discussions on changes in all parts of World Championships.

Planned events in 2020:

- Seminar for all breeding judges and candidates to be breeding judges (including exam), March 10-15, 2020, Hólar, Iceland
- Ringmaster seminar April in Norway, April 17-19, 2020
- Seminar for national breeding committee members and breeding leaders, November 2020
- Seminar for young breeding horse trainers (date and venue not decided yet)



Conclusion

Overall, the year 2018-2019 was successful, with a lot of work and activities in the FEIF Breeding committee and Breeding Judges committee and the breeding Registration Group.

Quarterly Committee report December 7, 2019 submitted by Nancy Brown

The Quarterly Committee released the eQuarterly of the December 2019 on November 21; printed copies are now in the mail. Issue Four 2019 features articles on volunteering at Landsmot, the NY and Iowa Breeding Shows, keeping Icelandics in a mixed herd, Moon Blindness in Icelandics, mounted archery, and more.

Following our 2019 budget, we printed 600 copies of this issue. The members mailing list was 539 copies and, since we send one extra copy to each of our advertisers and contributors, our total mailing list rose to 575 copies for this issue. We have reserved 15 copies for new member Welcome Packets, leaving 10 copies for Promotion, which the NEIHC has requested. We therefore have no extra copies available this quarter for other clubs' or individuals' promotional purposes.

We are currently canvassing the clubs to learn their 2020 needs, and are compiling our 2019 statistics on the number of copies used for new members and promotion. But, in advance of the budget meeting, we request that the Board consider raising our Issue One 2020 print run to 650 copies. This issue, which mails in March, goes to design on January 15 (before the Budget Meeting) and to press on February 1. Cost for printing the usual 600 copies, as per our 2020 bid, will be \$2810 (an increase of \$114 from 2019's prices due to the cost of paper); cost for printing 650 copies in March is \$160 more.

If we do not increase our print run in March, we will have no promotional copies available until June 2020.

In addition, it would be a great help if Board members and committee chairs could send their Annual Reports to the Quarterly before the Annual Meeting—preferably between January 1 and January 7—so that we can include that information in the March issue. Please send them to quarterly@icelandics.org.
