

## **USIHC Board Conference Call Minutes**

## March 10, 2020 8:00PM (Eastern)

Will Covert called the meeting to order at 8:05pm EST.

### 1. SECRETARY'S REPORT (MARTIN NIELSEN)

As of March10, 2020 the USIHC has 769 Members in 578 Households

### 2. TREASURER'S REPORT (KARI PIETSCH-WANGARD)

The monthly financial statements now include a detailed breakdown of the cash owned by the Congress. The key figures from the breakdown are:

Martin Nielsen moved to approve payment of an invoice from Doug Smith for \$166 for assistance with transfer of membership data and board/email history from the old to the new website. Leslie Chambers seconded the motion and the board voted unanimously in favor.

We have had two successful Riding Badge seminars this year. The first was held in WY at Kristina Behringer's farm and had 6 participants. All 6 completed Basic Level 1 and 3 completed Basic Level

two. They were examined by Caeli Cavanaugh who also tested them on Knapamerki. We were given some comments on how the two systems worked for this seminar and what we can do to improve our program. They are planning to hold the Pleasure Riding Badge seminar later this year. The second was held in February at Jana Meyer's farm in VT. She had 5 participants who all passed Basic Level 1 with Sigrun Brynjarsdóttir as examiner. Hopefully they will provide some photos for the next issue of the Quarterly.

The committee will continue discussions on developing a trainer certification program.

The S2SS online logging is working well. Attached are the February 25 standings for the S2SS ride. Additionally, we did receive the entry patches from The Studio for the 2020 ride and the volunteer Kim Taylor will be sending them out to the riders soon. The letter for donations is also being disseminated in hopes of having prizes to award the 2020 S2SS winners. I have also contacted the three Riders of the Month for January, February and March so they will be able to be part of the next quarterly.

## Breeding Committee Report March 2020

- I. The Breeding Committee has not met since the last USIHC board meeting. We have communicated via email.
- II. The California evaluation scheduled for August has been cancelled.
- III. There wil be two Breeding Education seminars in 2020. The first in April, at Harmony Icelandics in Iowa, and the second in October, in conjunction with the Breeding Evaluation, preceding the World Ranking show at Lettleiki Icelandics in Kentucky.
- IV. We are currently working on a Breeding Manual to be distributed by stallion owners to anyone interested in breeding a mare to their stallion. Topics currently include:
  - 1. Breeding Plan top consideration
    - a. Breeding goal
    - b. FEIF Breeding goal
    - c. Importance of breeding mares
    - d. How the foal will be raised and trained in the future
  - 2. How to use Worldfengur
    - a. BLUP
    - b. How to read assessments
    - c. Virtual Mate what to look for when deciding to breed two horses
  - 3. Knowledge about basic bloodlines and their characteristics
  - 4. Explanation of good gaits
  - 5. The evaluation process (including ridden and conformation assessments) and why it is important
  - 6. Filing a stallion report and registering offspring
  - 7. Raising a foal in the herd environment
- V. Virginia has contacted current breeders, those who have been active in the past as well as trainers in the U.S. and some international breeding judges. Martina Gates has agreed to help write sections of the manual as has Susy Oliver. Virginia will edit and hopes to have something for review when Arnar Bjarki Sigurdsson arrives for his breeding seminar at Harmony Icelandics in April.
