

USIHC Board Conference Call Minutes November 10, 2020 8:00PM (Eastern)

Present: Lori Cretney, Will Covert, Virginia Lauridsen, Leslie Chambers, Janet Mulder, Kari Pietsch-Wangard, Lucy Nold, Martin Nielsen. **Absent:** Emily Potts.

Will Covert called the meeting to order at 8:05pm EST.

1. SECRETARY'S REPORT (MARTIN NIELSEN)

As of November 6, 2020 the USIHC has 748 Members in 567 Households. Will Covert recently filled out a FEIF survey on how we have dealt with the COVID crisis on behalf of the USIHC.

2. TREASURER'S REPORT (KARI PIETSCH-WANGARD)

Reports are attached. The monthly financial statements now include a detailed breakdown of the cash owned by the Congress. The key figures from the breakdown are:

9. SPORT COMMITTEE REPORT (MARTIN NIELSEN)

The sport committee met on November 3rd (minutes attached).

10. YOUTH COMMITTEE REPORT (LUCY NOLD)

The youth committee will be brainstorming formats for the 2021 youth cup.

11. Old Business

a. Continued discussion on reviewing USIHC policies for anti-discrimination.

A Google Document has been shared with all board members for entry of completed training in diversity, inclusion, implicit bias, and antidiscrimination.

b. Follow-up on the pathway for analyzing DNA from unregistered Icelandic horses. See attached report and suggested verbiage for "participation number status".

The board approved the text for "participation number status" with two minor edits: The DNA case number should be referenced, and it should be specified that the participation number allows participation in non-ranking sport classes.

As for the work with setting up the procedure for DNA registration, the board discussed paying Emily Potts a one-time honorarium for developing the website infrastructure to accommodate for the new services and testing options offered. The board was supportive. Virginia Lauridsen made the motion to pay Emily \$500 as an honorarium. Leslie Chambers seconded the motion and the board voted unanimously in favor.

12. New Business

a. S2SS rules for 2021 (see attached)

Kari Pietsch-Wangard made the motion to approve the rules with one minor edit: to specify that all DNA verified Icelandic horses are eligible. Will Covert seconded the motion and the board voted unanimously in favor.

b. New requirements for Green Horse classes.

Martin Nielsen made the motion to approve the following rule:

"A horse is eligible for green horse classes for two consecutive calendar years following its first participation at a live in-person national ranking event."

The motion was seconded by several and the board voted unanimously in favor.

c. US residence status for riders qualifying for the US national team.

Martin Nielsen made the motion to approve the following two rules:

"In the event that more than seven riders qualify for the US national World Championship team, four placements will be prioritized for US residents"

"In the event that more than five young riders qualify for the US national World Championship team, three placements will be prioritized for US residents"

The motion was seconded by several, and the board voted unanimously in favor.

13. Miscellaneous.

The board briefly discussed the format and timing for the yearly USIHC membership meeting. It was decided to organize a virtual event with information and updates provided to the membership and time reserved for a questions and answers session. The details will be planned at the next board meeting. The board decided to schedule the meeting after the yearly FEIF meeting, which is planned for the first weekend of February. The USIHC yearly meeting was scheduled for Saturday, February 20 at 2pm Eastern.

The next USIHC board meeting will be on December 8, 2020 at 8pm EST.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:05pm EST.

Quarterly Committee report November 7, 2020 submitted by Nancy Brown

Issue Four 2020 of *The Icelandic Horse Quarterly* is now at press; our mailing date is December 1. The eQuarterly will be ready to be released on approximately November 15.

Issue Four 2020 features a focus on breeding, tips on riding transitions, more about collection, a introduction to distance riding, and other stories, as well as sharing news from USIHC Affiliated Clubs, the Board of Directors, and our parent organization, FEIF.

We are printing 600 copies of this issue, just enough to cover our membership and contributors' lists. These lists totaled 550 in September with 50 copies left over for Promotion and Welcome Packets. To request copies for promotional purposes, please contact <u>quarterly@icelandics.org</u>.

Deadline for Issue One 2021 (mailed in March) is January 1. Board members and committee chairs, please let us know if you want us to save space for any text, photos, or advertisements for that issue. Remember that ads for USIHC-sanctioned events and programs are free, space permitting.

USIHC Sport Committee meeting

Tuesday, November 3rd, 2020.

Present: Will Covert, Ásta Covert, Carrie Brandt, Alex Pregitzer, Lucy Nold, Leslie Chambers, Martin Nielsen.

Absent: Kristina Behringer, Susan Peters, Deborah Cook, Lori Cretney, NikkiSue Flanigan.

Martin called the meeting to order at 8:05pm EST. He welcomed everyone to the meeting as new sport committee chair and thanked Will for his long tenure in the position.

1. Reflections over sport events in 2020.

The committee found that the two virtual shows had been successful and well received. The committee recommends continuing with two yearly virtual shows, even when in-person shows will be able to resume. This would allow riders more opportunities for collecting points for the national ranking. The committee felt that it would be appropriate to increase the minimum requirement for making to the national ranking from two to three shows per year. This would ensure that at least one show is in-person. Furthermore, Leslie suggested that in-person shows could offer riders opportunity for filming a virtual show entry, while having access to an oval track at the showground.

2. Thoughts about events for 2021.

The group found it hard to predict how the COVID situation is going to develop during 2021, but the general notion was that the show schedule is likely to be affected to a significant degree. At this point, the only option is to plan for both in-person and virtual versions of different events. The committee hopes to be able to organize shows and judging seminar, but will be monitoring the situation closely.

3. Green horse classes requirements.

The group discussed requirements for horses entering (and qualifying out of) green horse classes. Rather than defining a threshold score, the committee found it more appropriate to define a horse as green when it is competing in its first show season.

4. Preparatory class for Judge Seminar/Test.

The committee discussed the prospects for developing a curriculum for a set of preparatory classes for people intending to take the FEIF judge test. Great Britain has recently developed a similar initiative. The idea is to develop a series of seminars and make use of Google Classroom for sharing material such as videos and posting assignments. The committee felt it would be a good idea to make the series open to everybody and not restrict it to judges or prospect judges. Martin and Leslie will contact Porgeir Guðlaugsson and gage his interest for developing the package and leading the initiative. In case he is interested, we will ask him to give us an estimate of what he would charge.

5. Setting the pace for more pace.

Carrie passionately made the argument that pace riding should be encouraged more in the US and suggested a number of initiatives. Two of these were to include the 100 m speedpace in the national ranking and provide a path for a pace rider to qualify for the world championships. The committee was generally supportive of the idea, but discussed some of the challenges with organizing pace events. The 100 m speedpace requires four judges, while seven judges are needed for the pace test. A 150 m race takes five judges. As most shows in the US only have one or two judges, it is a challenge to accommodate for these pace disciplines. Even a world ranking show with five FEIF judges does not have enough judges for the pace test discipline. The group discussed allowing for B and C judges to assist with these disciplines. Martin will discuss this further with Porgeir and see if he has any suggestions for how to best approach this.

Will also pointed out that standardized time keeping equipment would be another requirement, but this could be addressed. There would also be additional requirements for measuring out the track and ensuring that all specifications are correct.

6. Miscellaneous.

The committee discussed the upcoming world championship qualifications and agreed that the requirements should be published by the beginning of 2021. The group also agreed to propose that one requirement should be that the majority of riders in the US team should reside in the US. This would still allow US citizens based abroad to qualify for the team. Martin will add this to the agenda for the upcoming USIHC board meeting.

Meeting adjourned at 9:45pm EST.

Registration Committee Meeting Minutes 10-26-2020

The registration committee met via Zoom at 8 pm Eastern time.

Members present: Asta Covert, Virginia Lauridsen, Lucy Nold (chair)

Members excused: Emily Potts

The committee first began discussing the "participation" number and how it should be described and what the fee should be. All agreed it should be more expensive than the most expensive possibility for registration and agreed on \$250. Asta suggested that the fee could be applied to a future registration fee if the horse is able to be registered in the future. Virginia will draft a statement about the participation number for committee to edit.

Lucy reminded the committee that this will create a lot of additional work in setting up the website and creating forms. Virginia suggested we pay Emily a one-time fee for setting this up – perhaps \$250-\$500.

Lucy suggested we have very clear instructions on the registration home page: i.e "imported gelding, stallion, mare etc" and the corresponding fees.

The committee discussed combining the DNA and the registration fee together; geldings would be less. Lucy suggested packaging DNA and parentage but it could be problematic occasionally so leave it as is for now. The committee agreed that fees should encourage people to register their horses. We will keep the non-member fee to encourage people to join the USIHC. Asta suggested having boxes to check at checkout.

Asta mentioned that domestic born foals could almost be done online.

Lucy suggested having the stallion owner sign a registration paper at the time of breeding. Or perhapss an electronic signature for the stallion report and the registration papers. Asta agreed that this could make things easier.

Lucy noticed in doing research that we are by far the cheapest registry. Jockey Club is \$2000 after the horse is 2 years. Is it time to raise the registration fee? Asta suggested raising the fee after time has passed. Reward those who register early, and encourage the process, and charge for procrastination.

Lucy created a table of suggested fees for what the VGL is offering, but not all tests are applicable to Icelandics. The committee discussed what would be appropriate fees. Virginia suggested presenting Lucy's suggestions to the board.

People will check the box for coat tests and list if a specific test. We could list the available options.

The committee discussed using Paypal exclusively. Lucy noted that the more we can make the process electronic, the better success we will have. Asta agreed that Paypal is easier than checks. There are situations however when people need to send a check.

The meeting adjourned at 9:11 pm EST

USIHC "Participation" Number

All USIHC members are eligible to apply for a participation number for any horse with DNA verification as a purebred Icelandic horse. Participation numbers are intended for riders who would like to participate in USIHC events but whose horses are lacking the proper documentation needed for registration. Horses with participation numbers are eligible to participate in clinics, the Sea to Shining Sea program and any non-sanctioned FEIF classes offered at competitions. Should a horse with a participation number become eligible for registration in the future, the participation number fee will be applied to any registration fees.

Sea to Shining Sea Ride 2021

About The Ride

Sea 2 Shining Sea is a year long virtual ride on Icelandic Horses. This 5,000 mile 'ride' uses 20 checkpoints in 4 regions of the US starting January 1, 2021 ending December 31, 2021. Each checkpoint will count for 250 miles or 62.5 hours of riding.

Riders can participate as individuals or teams. All participants must be US Icelandic Horse Congress members throughout the ride to log their hours. Participants log their <u>time</u> riding which we will convert to distance at 4 miles-per-hour. This is easier for everyone to record. If you are riding as part of a team you should log your individual time. We will take care of crediting your rides to the correct group. Teams can only have a maximum of six riders.

The horses used in the ride must be registered Icelandic Horses. They do not have to be registered in the United States...any FEIF member country's registry or WorldFengur is acceptable.

The Sea 2 Shining Sea ride is for leisure riders. You participate by riding or driving your Icelandic horse however you like – as long as you are not being paid for the time. The route is designed stage stop style. The checkpoints do not make one continuous trail, but are actual places that you can go and ride your horse in the USA during the year 2021. Local clubs may host rides at some of the locations, these will be announced on the S2SS FB page and you are welcome to join!

You will log your hours by logging into <u>www.icelandics.org</u> with your USIHC Member login, select the "Ride" tab to find *Sea 2 Shining Sea Ride*. Hours must be entered in decimal format and you can log hours weekly or daily, the new week begins on Wednesday EST and ends Tuesday at 11:59 EST. If you accidentally log hours incorrectly you can log negative hours (ex: -2.5) to adjust your hours.

Once the week is over, you need to start your hours at zero again. Please, do not carry hours forward between weeks. Since this ride is aimed at leisure activities, we expect your weekly total will be under 20 hours. If you have a really big week, you will need to e-mail your hours to us with a short description of what you did during the week. Lastly, hours count when you are doing an activity with your horse...not watching someone's lesson or auditing a clinic. It is one on one with a horse.

We have created a Sea 2 Shining Sea Facebook page (<u>https://www.facebook.com/groups/</u> <u>1866794093559110/</u>) and encourage everyone to share photos and stories about their rides.

Rider Recognition

Each participant receives a patch with our logo, when they log their first hours.

When each individual or team passes the quarter milestones, they get a post made for them on the FB group celebrating their achievement.

Riders participating in the Sea 2 Shining Sea program, will have their names put in a hat for a random drawing to determine the Rider of the Month. Each month a different name will be drawn. A write-up of the Rider of the Month will be posted on Facebook and will be featured in *The Icelandic Horse Quarterly.* This is to help the Sea 2 Shining Sea participants get to know each other better.

The Fine Print

- Participants must be USIHC members throughout the entire program.
- Horses must be Icelandic horses, registered with a FEIF registry.
- Horses need not be owned by the participants.
- Each member can only enter once.
- Members participate as individuals or in teams. Teams can only have a maximum of 6 riders.

- Once participants join a team they must remain with the group for the rest of the ride. Changing teams is not allowed mid-ride.
- Logged time transfers if participants join a team.
- Participants may start any time during the ride.
- Progress is <u>logged</u> in hours ridden and converted to distances using a 4 MPH conversion.
- Paid riding time is not eligible.
- Participants must log their hours by logging into <u>www.icelandics.org</u> with your USIHC Member login, select the "Ride" tab to find *Sea 2 Shining Sea Ride*. Hours must be entered in decimal format and you can log hours weekly or daily, the new week begins on 12:00 AM Wednesday ET and ends Tuesday at 11:59 pm ET. If you accidentally log hours incorrectly you can log negative hours (ex: -2.5) to adjust your hours.
- Participants must record hours weekly by Tuesday 12PM (ET). Failure to record, results in lost hours.
- Participants submitting more than 20 hours for a week, must provide details for the long hours by e-mailing <u>s2ss@icelandics.org</u>.
- Rider of the Month All riders participating in the Sea 2 Shining Sea program for 2021 season have agreed to have their names put in a hat for a random drawing to determine Rider of the Month. Each month a different name will be drawn. A write-up of the Rider of the Month will go in *The Icelandic Horse Quarterly*.
