Will Covert called the meeting to order at 8:04pm EST.

1. SECRETARY'S REPORT (MARTIN NIELSEN)

As of February 8, 2021, the USIHC has 805 members in 606 households.

2. TREASURER'S REPORT (LORI CRETNEY/KARI PIETSCH-WANGARD) See attached files.

5. SPORT COMMITTEE REPORT (MARTIN NIELSEN)

The committee met on January 25 to discuss budget requests and plan the virtual show and world championship try-outs for the spring. Minutes will be included in the next meeting.

6. 2021 BUDGET

Approved budget documents are attached. Minor edits were made to the proposed budget during the discussion. Jeff Rose made the motion to approve the budget with these changes, and Leslie Chambers seconded the motion. The budget was unanimously approved.

7. Old Business

a. Planning of the USIHC membership meeting.

The board was happy with the program. Emily will advertise it. She will also put together a PowerPoint presentation based on the submitted 2020 reports. The board agreed to keep presentations short and allow time for questions and answers.

b. Follow-up on the pathway for analyzing DNA from unregistered Icelandic horses.

A final agreement with the UC Davis Veterinary Genetics Lab is now ready and will be signed by Will Covert as soon as possible.

c. Further discussion of in-person USIHC events in 2021.

As agreed at the January meeting, the board will evaluate the pandemic situation at every meeting. So far, some large equine shows are still scheduled for the spring, but others, such as the Kentucky Landrover 3-Day Event. have been cancelled. The board will keep monitoring this situation.

d. Discussion of Virtual Breeding seminar in March (Virginia Lauridsen).

Virginia Lauridsen is planning a virtual breeding seminar with Arnar for March 13-14. The board approved a \$500 budget, and Virginia is planning on \$50 fee for members and \$75 for non-members. Emily will help with advertising and online payment.

8. New Business

a. Discussion of the possibility for the USIHC to join the United States Dressage **Federation**. See attached documents.

Janet Mulder had proposed for the USIHC to join the USDF to give members access to additional show opportunities. The basic yearly fee is \$240, but a membership comes with a commitment to sponsor first and second place awards for each level with members competing. The estimated cost for this is \$540 for one year. Leslie Chambers made the motion to spend the \$540 to explore a relationship with the USDF and reevaluate after one year. Virginia Lauridsen seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

9. Miscellaneous.

The next meeting will be Tuesday, March 9 at 8pm EST.

US Trainer Certification Meeting 2-1-2021

Virginia called the meeting to order at 6:35 Central time.

The first item for discussion was the peer review of questions concerning training and teaching. Caeli, Laura and Carrie will do that immediately following the meeting.

The next discussion item is practical skills. The FEIF matrix has mandatory requirements:

Good practical riding skills Basic gaits Basic dressage movements and aids Seats (3-point, deep, light Suppling exercises Achieve progress over time in a training schedule Basic skills in ground work Leading a horse from different positions (leading from both sides, following sending ahead) Pony a horse in walk, trot, and canter Basics in lunging Carrie suggested looking at Holar tests or IPZV tests to make this more specific

Caeli suggested using suggestions from the survey

Obstacle course and "scary" situations; how does the trainer react? Show that the trainer can identify and make a plan for correcting gait faults Teaching a lesson; opinion was divided on whether it was important to teach different age groups.

Jana suggested drawing names of students of different levels. Caeli suggested using the Holar system of having different trainers teach the same student(s).

Alex mentioned that group lessons require a different skill than private. Laura suggested that group lessons are more difficult.

Carrie suggested having the applicant do an introduction to the Icelandic Horse from the saddle. The committee agreed that demonstrating a group lesson, a private lesson and a demonstration are all very important.

Caeli reminded the group of the requirement of a 20 minute public lecture on some aspect of the Icelandic horse; applicants would need to have the topic approved. Carrie suggested the presentation could be part of a "graduation" ceremony and is more theory related.

Jana and Alex said in Germany they must present some of these skills in the prerequisite courses. One of them is lunging, one of them is assessment of the horse's condition which could be good to demonstrate.

Carrie suggested at Holar that skills were demonstrated with a bridle, first with reins in hand and them over the head. She suggested doing some testing work in hand with the rope halter.

Jana suggested that for the Fast Track the testing might be more rigorous and last longer because there is no other place to see them. The committee agreed that the Fast Track tests will just need to be longer because these are essential skills. Carrie reminded

Carrie suggests four tests for Ground Work:

Work in hand with rope halter Work in hand bridle Lunging Ponying

Riding skills is tougher. The committee first discussed the German system: For the dressage test Jana said in Germany the dressage skills are tested in a group setting. You warm up alone and then do have to do assigned exercises both with and without stirrups. Optional to change horses.

Simple figures Walk, trot, canter both hands Circles Turn on the fore Leg yielding Speed control Arena rules Figure 8's Simple serpentine

In Germany then there is a riding test on the gait test on the oval track (four gait and tolt test). Applicants can bring more than one horse. Caeli suggested having them ride a horse they don't know. Ideally the horse would have good or at least decent gaits.

There is also a signal riding (loose rein, horse is not on the aids) test. Jana said only light seat is tested in trainer C. In the silver badge test you need two point, ground poles and jumping. Laura said two point is important but not jumping. Alex mentioned that the different seats are important. Maybe the obstacle course could test some skills? Could we put these skills in the dressage test? Laura suggested calling it "simplification of the aids." i.e. use one rein, light seat, one stirrup.

The meeting adjourned at 7:45 Central Time Next Meeting Tuesday, February 16 at 7:30 Eastern Time.



agrees to participate in the USDF All-Breeds award program for 2021 and understands and agrees to the terms below. We understand that this signed letter of agreement and our one-year Business Membership application must be received in the USDF office by March 1, 2021. We also understand that we are committed to the terms and awards recognized for this one-year period. No changes may be made during this time, except to add more award categories/placings to the already agreed upon categories/placings. The deadline to add more award categories/placings is June 1, 2021.

It is USDF's responsibility to provide competitors with information on USDF's requirements for the Adequan®/USDF All-Breeds award program. However, as each organization's requirements (award eligibility) are unique to each organization, it is each organization's responsibility to communicate their requirements to their members.

All-Breeds Participating Organization Responsibilities to USDF:

- Select the divisions and number of places you wish to recognize (see addendum).
 - > The mandatory division for awards is the open division.
 - All POs must agree to recognize the champion and reserve champion in the mandatory open division; recognizing third through fifth place is optional.
 - > All other divisions (Adult Amateur, Vintage Cup, Dressage Sport Horse Breeding, etc.) are optional.
 - All POs must agree to recognize at least first place in each level of any optional category that they choose, although they will have the option to recognize up to fifth place per level.
 - All POs must adhere to the minimum eligibility requirements published by USDF which are printed in the USDF Member Guide and on the USDF website.
- Each PO must submit with their signed Letter of Agreement a sample copy of their acceptable breed registry papers or a sample copy of acceptable breed registry papers required from another breed registry or both if applicable (if not previously submitted). In order to participate in the Adequan®/USDF All-Breeds award program, the PO must either issue breed/performance registry papers and/or require official breed registry papers from another breed registry for proof of eligibility.
- Pay the cost of \$25 per placing as indicated on the addendum. Invoices will be mailed during the month of November. Payment will be due within 30 days of date of invoice.
- Become a USDF Business Member at \$240. The USDF Business membership year is December 1-November 30. 2021 Business Membership is due no later than at time of this application.
- Verify horses from your organization are eligible for All-Breeds awards throughout the competition year, and by the designated USDF deadline.
- Submit Bylaws and/or Articles of Incorporation, A Statement of Philosophy for the organization and proof of a least 25 registered horses (if not previously submitted).
- Provide a link to www.usdf.org from your website.
- Inform your members on your website about your participation in the All-Breeds program, what awards you recognize, and what your specific requirements are for participation.
- Add USDF on your association's mailing list for its publications.

USDF's Responsibilities to All-Breeds Participating Organization:

- Communication to competitors via the USDF Member Guide, USDF website and USDF Connection magazine, the USDF eligibility requirements, the verification policy, preliminary award standings, and the intent of each All-Breeds PO regarding the number of placings to be recognized in each level of the required and optional divisions.
- Program and/or organization visibility:
 - Annual Yearbook of USDF Connection
 - > One additional issue of *USDF Connection*
 - USDF Awards Banquet Book
 - > USDF website list of All-Breeds POs, website link, and contact information
 - Assistance with identifying current and potential horses for your organization, including:
 - Provide a listing of all USDF horses declared for your organization on the USDF website, whether or not they are currently competing.
 - Provide a list of horses that have declared for your organization and are USDF Lifetime Horse Registered, have at least three scores of 58 percent or higher, from two different USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions in the current competition year on the USDF website in a password protected area.
 - Provide a list of all qualified horses ranked in every division recognized by the PO for the current year on the USDF website.
- Awarding of a custom cast USDF medal to each champion and reserve champion in each category and level chosen by the PO as well as to provide individualized online certificates for each category and level chosen by the PO.
 - Champions and reserve champions will be awarded their medals at the USDF Salute Gala & Annual Awards Banquet. Medals not picked up at the banquet will be mailed by USDF.
 - > All POs are entitled to present All-Breeds awards on stage and USDF will provide one complementary ticket for the presenter at the awards ceremony. Other tickets may be purchased.
