

USIHC Board Conference Call Minutes September 21, 2021 8:00PM (Eastern)

Will Covert called the meeting to order at 8:05PM EDT.

1. SECRETARY'S REPORT (MARTIN NIELSEN)

As of September 21, 2021 the USIHC has 776 Members in 599 Households. Martin also wrote up the notification of the new membership fee structure and has passed it on to the Quarterly and to Emily Potts. It has been posted on the USIHC website and will be shared on Social Media over the next few weeks.

2. TREASURER'S REPORT (LORI CRETNEY)

Reports are attached for June and July. The monthly financial statements now include a detailed breakdown of the cash owned by the Congress. The key figures from the June breakdown are:

The US Trainer Certification Committee met on Thursday, September 9. The code of ethics document has now been finalized and is on today's agenda for board approval. The committee is ready to begin testing Fast Track applicants next summer/fall (depending on the availability of European judges). Fast-track criteria will be discussed under new business.

6. LEISURE COMMITTEE REPORT (JANET MULDER)

S2SS ride mileage accomplishments for end of August are attached. Two teams have finished and the committee has started preparing the 2022 S2SS ride.

7. PROMOTIONS AND WEBSITE REPORT (EMILY POTTS)

8. QUARTERLY COMMITTEE REPORT (NANCY BROWN)

9. SPORT COMMITTEE REPORT (MARTIN NIELSEN)

A few in-person shows have been approved for the fall; Léttleiki Icelandics (NR and WR), Montaire (NR), and Flying C (NR) are scheduled for October and November. The Alaska Icelandic Horse Association changed their NR show to a schooling show due to difficulties with getting a judge. The NR/WR show in Kentucky will be judged by one international judge and four domestic judges. Given that two of these are B judges, Jeff Rose made the motion to waive the exclusion of B judges from WR shows, given the challenges posed by the pandemic. Leslie Chambers seconded the motion and the board voted unanimously in favor.

10. YOUTH COMMITTEE REPORT (LUCY NOLD)

11. Old Business

a. American Youth Cup Fund (draft policy attached)

Jeff Rose had drafted a policy paper describing the fund. Will Covert made the motion to approve the policy as Policy # 38. Leslie Chambers seconded the motion and the board unanimously approved the policy.

The website infrastructure is roughly in place for the listing, but Virginia will meet with Emily to get the last details taken care of. The committee will meet prior to the next board meeting.

c. Trainer code of ethics (attached)

The code of ethics was presented for final board approval. Jeff Rose made the motion to approve the document. Lucy Nold seconded and the board unanimously approved it.

12. New Business

a. Fast-track criteria for trainers (attached).

The fast-track requirements were presented for final board approval. Lucy Nold made the motion to approve the document with one minor edit (adding the word cumulative for the description of internship duration under item 3). Jeff Rose seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

Quarterly Committee report September 16, 2021 submitted by Nancy Brown

Quarterly Issue Three 2021 was posted online on September 1 and mailed September 10, a little late due to problems the printer is having sourcing paper. We should be back on schedule for Issue Four.

Issue Three features articles on virtual shows and hybrid clinics, riding in harmony, training tips for a horse that stumbles or one that has "lost its brakes," and how to host a clinic, as well as news from the USIHC Affiliated Clubs, the Board of Directors, and our parent organization, FEIF.

We printed 600 copies of this issue and mailed 561 to USIHC members and Quarterly contributors, leaving about 40 copies for new-member Welcome Packets and promotion. If you would like promotional copies, contact us at quarterly@icelandics.org.

We are now gathering submissions for Issue Four 2021, to be mailed in December. Please send articles, photos, and advertisements to <u>quarterly@icelandics.org</u>. Board members and committee chairs, please let us know if you want us to save space for you in this issue. Remember that ads for USIHC-sanctioned events are free, space permitting. Deadline for submissions is October 1.

(Draft) Policy XX - Acceptance and Use of Youth Cup / Youth Event Funds

USIHC members privately host USIHC-affiliated youth events, including the Youth Cup. These members have privately collected funds to host such events wholly independent of the USIHC. In some circumstances, this has resulted in a surplus of funds following the event, leaving the host(s) looking to utilize or donate that money for future USIHC-affiliated youth events, including the Youth Cup.

The purpose of this policy is to provide a mechanism for prior event hosts to donate excess funds to the USIHC and for the USIHC to earmark such funds for use in future USIHC-affiliated youth events, including future Youth Cup events.

It is the policy of the USIHC to allow youth cup event hosts who have excess funds to allow those funds to be donated to the USIHC. The USIHC will receive those funds as an ordinary donation as part of the USIHC's non-profit mission. The funds will be deposited into one or more of the USIHC's existing bank accounts. The funds will be tracked via a separate sub-account in the USIHC's bookkeeping software. The USIHC will endeavor to utilize all funds received under this policy to fund and / or support future USIHC-affiliated youth events, with an emphasis on Youth Cup events.

In enacting this policy and / or accepting donated funds from prior youth cup hosts or sponsors, the USIHC is not providing tax or legal advice to the prior youth cup hosts, sponsors, or members. Any USIHC members who privately host events of any kind are solely responsible for the tax and / or legal consequences of their actions. Any and all tax consequences resulting from the receipt of funds related to this policy remain the sole responsibility of the party receiving such funds.

USIHC Trainer Code of Ethics

The USIHC requires that all trainers certified by the USIHC and FEIF abide by the following code of ethics. The recognition and practice of these ethical principles is vital to creating and maintaining a happy, healthy and pleasurable environment for all involved.

I. Respect and Equality

- a. Show respect to each individual you encounter, regardless of gender, age, race, nationality, religion, ethnicity, physical disabilities, or sexual orientation.
- b. Attend to the welfare, safety and health of all horses you work with, and treat all horses with dignity, regardless of gender, age, breed, ability, physical condition and use.
- c. Behave in a courteous manner and display good sportsmanship, following the guidelines of the USIHC, FEIF and applicable animal welfare laws.

II. Honesty

a. Be open, honest and fair, and conduct business affairs with integrity and sincerity.

III. Responsibility

- a. Take responsibility for your own actions, exercising sound judgement and professional competence.
- b. Take responsibility for all humans and horses in your care.
- c. Commit to responsible training techniques
- d. Keep the age, ability, fitness, and well-being of both horse and rider in mind when training and teaching.

IV. Education

- a. a. Always seek to expand your knowledge, and perform continuing education to improve skills. Be aware of any new FEIF guidelines as well as best practices regarding teaching, training and the wellbeing of horses.
- b) Know applicable FEIF rules and guidelines, and keep apprised of any updates and changes.
- c) Promote knowledge of the Icelandic Horse and its correct use as a riding and competition horse in accordance with the policies of FEIF and the USIHC.

V. Stewardship

a. Protect humans and horses in your care from unethical, incompetent or illegal practices.

VI. Example

- a. Every trainer and riding instructor is a role model for their clients. Be aware of your influence and act in ways that demonstrate best practices, and guide students and clients towards the same goal.
- b. Encourage those under your supervision to abide by ethical standards.

VII. Welfare of the Horse

a. The welfare of the horse must be considered above all other interests. This includes both physical and mental wellbeing, which is paramount.

- b. Trainers should provide the highest standards possible in maintaining horses under their care, taking into consideration the natural needs of horses as herd and flight animals.
- c. When training horses, and using them for equine activities in leisure or competition, trainers should consider their talent, abilities and psychological wellbeing.
- d. No horse deemed unfit should be ridden or worked. Veterinary advice must be sought if there is ever a question concerning a horses fitness for the proposed activity.
- e. Abuse of a horse using natural or artificial aids (e.g. whips, spurs, etc.) will not be tolerated.
- f. Horses must be transported in a manner that minimizes the potential for illness, injury, fear, stress or undue suffering and be allowed suitable rest periods during and following transport.
- g. Horses must be given adequate food, water, and health care and properly handled in an environment appropriate to their use with thoughtful consideration of their species-typical biology and behavior.
- h. Horses should be cared for in ways that minimize fear, pain, stress and suffering.
- i. Horses should be provided protection from injurious heat or cold and harmful weather conditions.
- j. Horses used in competition, spectator events, exhibitions, motion pictures and television should not be subjected to the fraudulent use of drugs, non-nutritive agents, equipment or procedures intended to alter performance, conformation or appearance.
- k. Horses shall be treated with respect and dignity throughout their lives and, when necessary, and at the appropriate time, be provided a humane death.

Requirements for "Fast-track" Testing

All participants have completed 6 of the following ten requirements:

- 1. 50% of income as a trainer or 20 hours per week as a trainer
- 2. Inclusion in national ranking or student's inclusion
- 3. Prolonged internship with FEIF level three trainer (6 mo. or more); trainer sign-off
- 4. Rider or trainer of a horse over 7.80 in breeding evaluations for rideability.
- 5. Letter of recommendation from a client who has had a horse in training for 3 months or more AND a letter of recommendation from a student who has been taking lessons for 3 months or more
- 6. Has experience hosting a clinic with at least 6 persons
- 7. Proof of presenting the Icelandic horse at an expo.
- 8. Knapamerki 1-4
- 9. Riding Badge; completion of competition level 2 and pleasure riding level 2
- 10. Outside certification from a university or outside equine certification.
